

Video: PBS premieres a 'Mister Rogers'inspired series

Even though **Fred Rogers** died almost a decade ago, I still miss his kind and loving presence in the world.

As creator/host of *Mister Rogers' Neighborhood*, Rogers influenced generations of children for more than 40 years. Next month, PBS Kids will debut a show from <u>The Fred Rogers Company</u> -- and it will look familiar to those of us who were glued to the original.

<u>Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood</u> is an animated series for preschoolers that stars a 4-year-old talking tiger. And although that sounds nothing like Mister Rogers' world, after you watch it for a minute, several images are sure to evoke memories.

First, there's the fact that Daniel starts his day by putting on a sweater and tying his sneakers. Then there's the (animated) set, which includes items from Rogers' Neighborhood of Make-Believe, like the trolley and King Friday's castle.

Characters include Katerina Kittycat, daughter of Henrietta Pussycat; Miss Elaina, daughter of Lady Elaine; and Prince Wednesday, a member of King Friday's royal family. (Daniel himself is supposed to be the son of Daniel Striped Tiger, who was on the original show.)
